Dear Parent(s), carer(s) and students,

Welcome back to a new academic year. I do hope that everyone had a lovely summer and managed to find time with family and friends, and perhaps a holiday too.

I am already aghast that we are two weeks into the new term, but time flies when we are having fun and there has certainly been a buzz around school this past 10 days. Students and staff have settled back in well. It is never easy when you have been away from something for more than 6 weeks and revisiting routines and expectations is essential to get back into the swing of things.

I had the privilege of welcoming back every Year from 7 to 11 in assemblies last Wednesday and Thursday, and once again I reminded them about our mission to always "strive to achieve our personal best", a good message is one that is worth repeating time and time again, and I made no apology for this.

I shared with them one of my inspirations from a summer of sport, more specifically the Paris 2024 Olympics. Armand Duplantis has now broken his own personal best, and therefore the world record, on at least 10 occasions, every time by only a cm or two. That dedication to be that little bit better every day, never satisfied with what we were before is, I hope, inspiration to us all that we can always be a little bit better, day in day out.



Summer exam results

This was certainly true of our Year 11 and Year 13 classes of 2024 who stepped up in so many ways, not least by producing at Key Stage 4 some of the best, if not the best, results Hagley has ever had. We had the best results in English of all secondary schools in Worcestershire, with more than 9 in every 10 students achieving at least a standard pass (a C grade in old money). We had the second highest average attainment score with 80% of students gaining pass grades or higher in both English and Maths. There was so much to celebrate, and the students did themselves proud. The Year 11 class of 2024 was also the highest attending Year 11 in the previous 5 years so that strong correlation between good attendance and good outcomes is there for all to see.

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We also had some amazing outcomes from our Sixth Form cohort too. Students taking A levels on average got a grade B- while more than 20% of entries achieved at least AAB. Consequently, we have Hagley alumni off to some of the most prestigious universities and higher level apprenticeships. 80% of all students got their first choice University with 40% going to a Russell Group establishment. This year we had students also head off to Cambridge to study medicine, to Yale, Connecticut, USA and one student start a prestigious higher level apprenticeships at Jaguar

Landrover having beaten 6000+ candidates to this position.

Uniform, standards and expectations

High standards of uniform and expectations has always been central to running a calm, ordered and safe school, where members of our family can come together unified by a common identity and set of expectations for all.

Can I take this opportunity to remind everyone about some core uniform expectations for Year 7 to 11:

- 1. Girls skirts **must** not be rolled at the waistband but worn at all times as designed.
- 2. Piercings **can only be** worn in the ear, with a maximum of one small (4mm) plain stud in each lobe. Other facials piercings **must** be removed and **cannot** be concealed by plasters, **this is not negotiable**.
- 3. School shoes **must** be black leather shoes and **not** trainer type shoes with sports branding.
- 4. Coats must be plain black or navy and not branded

Attendance

We will continue to drive hard this year on ensuring absence is kept to an absolute minimum and respond accordingly to the Department of Education drive to return school attendance to, at least, pre-pandemic norms. I make no apology for this; the benefits of high attendance are there for everyone to see. There is strong correlation between GCSE and A Level outcomes and attendance. In Year 11 alone last year students whose attendance was above 95% averaged more than a grade higher than students with attendance below 90%. Students with above 95% attendance also averaged a grade 6 across all their subjects, while students below 90% averaged less than a 4. The contrast is stark.

It is not only outcomes that are affected by high attendance. Students who attend regularly have better mental health, they feel more included, sustain better relationships, are less isolated and engage more fully in extra-curricular opportunities.

Please support your child and us in doing everything you can to ensure they are in school and remember "<u>Good</u> <u>attendance means attending school on time, every day, unless too unwell to do so."</u>

The Department for Education has published new guidance on school attendance that came into force on 19th August. You can read the guidance at this link: Working together to improve school attendance

Please be aware that absences that are not authorised, for example a holiday in term time, can lead to a penalty notice if a student has 10 or more unauthorised absences in a 10 week period. In addition, it is really important that appointments, where possible, are made outside of school times.
